#### Coronavirus

Public Health England

As you are no doubt aware the health and safety risks associated with the coronavirus are changing daily. As a school we are keeping up to date with advice and guidance from both the Department of Education and Public Health England. In line with this advice we have been operating as usual but with more stringent hygiene routines in place and adhering to strict absence timescales following sickness bugs (48 hours).

However, last night's government and NHS guidance, now advises anyone with a temperature over 37.5 degrees or a new continuous cough, to remain at home for 7 days. Please see specific guidance "Stay at home: guidance for people with confirmed or possible coronavirus (COVID-19) infection" Published 12th March 2020. We appreciate this will impact significantly on families but it is sadly unavoidable in such unprecedented times.

Whilst we remain open, we would be foolish not to plan for more radical approaches given the strategies other countries have taken recently. With this in mind, we are taking the precautionary measure of preparing for school closures. We would like to reassure parents that if this is a course of action that we are forced to take, then we will endeavour to provide daily home learning activities and will share these via our website as well as some additional paper based activities so as not to disadvantage your child/children.

It will be essential to keep communication lines open with you all during this time. The best way of doing this will be through the School Spider app so please ensure you are logged in at all times.

We are obviously hopeful that we do not need to take these measures but it is always better to be prepared for the worst.


